Oriel Sixth Form is an exciting, supportive and innovative place to spend your post-16 studies. We work with our students to build upon the foundations from years 7-11 at Oriel High School or elsewhere, increasing the expectation of students to work independently whilst using your relationships with expert teachers and tutors to enhance your progression.

It also allows you, as one of the most senior members of the school, to take on responsibilities as a role model and leader for our younger students. Our Results

We are proud of the results achieved by our students. Progress being made by students in the Sixth Form is good and we are always looking for ways to make it even better.

Taking our Sixth Form students from their starting point on GCSE Results Day through 2 years of quality teaching, independent work and support means our students achieve their expected grades and can follow their dreams into whatever their next steps may be.

We consistently outperform the local and national picture in the number of students that stay with us from Year 12 into Year 13 - 96% of students progressed from Year 12 into Year 13 (West Sussex 79%*).

We will always celebrate the successes of the full range of students who join our Sixth Form- look around you tonight and you will see many different stories with many different combinations of subjects achieving their 'next step' after Sixth Form. That is what we are all about.

Building a Sixth Form Programme

Most of our Year 12 students begin the Sixth Form studying 3 A Level courses or equivalents, for example:

A Level Biology/ A Level Mathematics/ A Level French

Or.

Applied Science National BTEC/ Business CTEC Diploma

Or

A Level Media Studies / A Level Psychology/ Health & Social Care CTEC Extended Certificate

We encourage all A Level Scientists who are not studying A Level Maths to take CORE Maths; this should be a fourth option.

Other students are also welcome to add this as a fourth subject.

Students wishing to study a fourth subject that is not Further Maths will need a strong academic profile including 5x Grade 8 at GCSE.

Students have the option to further enhance their profile by completing the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) in the second year providing their academic progress is strong in year one.

Most students progress from Oriel's Year 11 into Sixth Form. However, you don't need to live in the catchment area or even to have been to Oriel High School to join our popular and supportive Sixth Form and every year we welcome students from other Crawley schools and from further afield.

Sixth Form Admissions criteria:

- 5 or more grades 4-9; including equivalents across at least 4 subjects
- Maths and English Language Grade 4 or above
- Average GCSE GRADE of at least 3.5 (average of ALL GCSE full courses taken)

Entry Requirements for A Level courses

- 5 or more grades 5-9; including equivalents across at least 5 subjects
- Maths and English Language Grade 4 or above
- Average GCSE GRADE of at least 4
- Maths and Science subjects require average GCSE grade of at least 4.75

A few final words from our Senior Student Team

In Year 12, we visited Poland, where we explored its history, including topics like Communism and World War Two.
Experiences like these have deepened my understanding of the world and made learning more meaningful.

I'm currently applying to study Biochemistry at university, with the goal of pursuing a career in Medical Research. I'm excited about the opportunity to contribute to scientific discoveries, and I'm grateful to Oriel for helping me take the first steps towards that future.

I chose these subjects because they combine my curiosity for science with an interest in people, the environment, and how they interact — all of which link to my ambition of studying Medicine.

Next year, I hope to begin a degree that allows me to pursue a career in Healthcare.

A highlight of my Sixth Form experience has been building confidence through volunteering and academic challenges. It has been an exciting journey so far and I wouldn't have done it without the support of all my teachers.

Choosing to stay at Oriel to study for my A levels has been one of my best decisions. From the start, I was welcomed into a supportive environment where teachers genuinely cared about my success. Their encouragement has helped me achieve academically and given me the confidence to believe in myself. Smaller classes and personal support have made such a difference, giving me the chance to ask questions, grow, and truly flourish.

I have been able to study a specific combination of subjects that both challenge and interest me, alongside a close group of friends. Whilst vastly different in scope, my subjects are similar in that they allow me to understand the world learning the physical and chemical explanations behind life, as well as how societies and people change over time to develop our world today, which is something that especially interests me.

Deciding to complete my A Levels at Oriel couldn't have been a better decision. As an ex-homeschool student, the small classes allow for stronger relationships with teachers and peers, enabling a better academic experience. Support is also easy to access, which I have found useful when tailoring studying and revision to my personal requirements, as well as when looking to apply to universities/apprenticeships.
